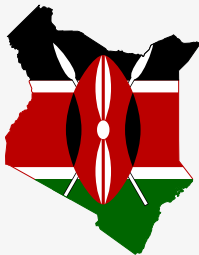

LATEST REPORT FROM KENYA

In July, we began to implement the plan for outreach to schools where we held several meetings with primary school head teachers and secondary school principals to plan for the school outreaches.

SCHOOLS

The programme will involve outreach to the pupils in schools, and, at times, during the holidays. We agreed on conducting a short outreach during the 10.00 am break, once in a while in a school, where the students gather at the parade and the speakers give short testimonies within thirty minutes. The other way is to organise an outreach in schools during the holidays and invite the students. The Nairobi Parents Association (NPA) will also give BMF a chance to conduct outreaches to parents during parents Annual General Meetings in schools and other special NPA meetings.

Our garbage collectors were involved in collection of garbage in several schools in Njiru and Kasarani subcounties. This programme has been used by God to open the opportunity for us to do outreaches in schools.

This month we have started with Njiru and Kasarani Subcounty where we reached four schools. The pupils were very attentive and most responded to the prayer for salvation, before they were dismissed to return to classes.

SUMMARY

Over 4,721 pupils were reached through the school outreaches with an estimated 2,700 responding for the salvation call. In total, 2,716 people responded to the call for salvation, and over 4,721 people were reached in July 2022.

250 people have been enrolled to work as garbage collectors.

All people reached up to date = 79,490

All people commitment to the Lord = 36,705

REPORT ON BMF-UGANDA WORK FOR JULY 2022

On 29th July, Tamale Moses and I went to Wabusaana Prison. We arrived there at 2.00pm when some men were still out for labour work, so we had to wait until they came back at 4.00pm. When they came back the OC ordered all of them to assemble on the veranda of their cells. It was drizzling but we used umbrellas and managed to stand in a good position so that everybody could hear us clearly. Moses gave a brief explanation about BMF followed by his short testimony, and then I gave my full story. 273 men received salvation out of the 311 enrolled in that unit. 16 men were sick and they had spent 3 days when they had not been able to go for work. We prayed for them, and the OC communicated to me the following day that 7 of them had improved, and the other 9 got healed completely and went for labour work the following day. We donated 5 boxes of washing soap and four Bibles to the prison at the end.

On 30th July, Tamale Moses and I went to Makulubita Prison. We arrived there at 7.30am because the OC had already told us the previous day that some of the men would be going into the fields for labour work at 9.00am. At exactly 8.00am all the 279 men enrolled in that unit were already assembled in the main hall. Tamale Moses gave a brief explanation about BMF followed by his short testimony in 15 minutes, and then I gave my full story for 30 minutes. 243 men received salvation, Moses took 5 more minutes to explain to men more about Jesus Christ whom they have chosen as their Saviour, and then we gave them the gifts of 5 boxes of washing soap and 4 Bibles at the end. Everything was timed well. I believe Jesus was in charge.

On 31st July, Tamale Moses and I went to Nkozi Prison. We arrived there at 1.00pm, when the inmates had just started lunch. We waited for 40 minutes and then the Officer on duty assembled all the 371 men enrolled in that unit under the big mango tree which was in the compound. Moses gave a brief explanation about BMF followed by his short testimony, and then I gave my full story. 316 men received salvation of which 29 were Muslims. Moses had prepared a Scripture for men who received salvation, and he took 20 minutes to explain to them the message behind that Word of God, which would help most of them to become spiritually mature. I prayed for all men with needs and am sure God will work for them, one by one. We donated 5 boxes of washing soap and four Bibles to the prison at the end.

Number of men received salvation in July 2022 = 822

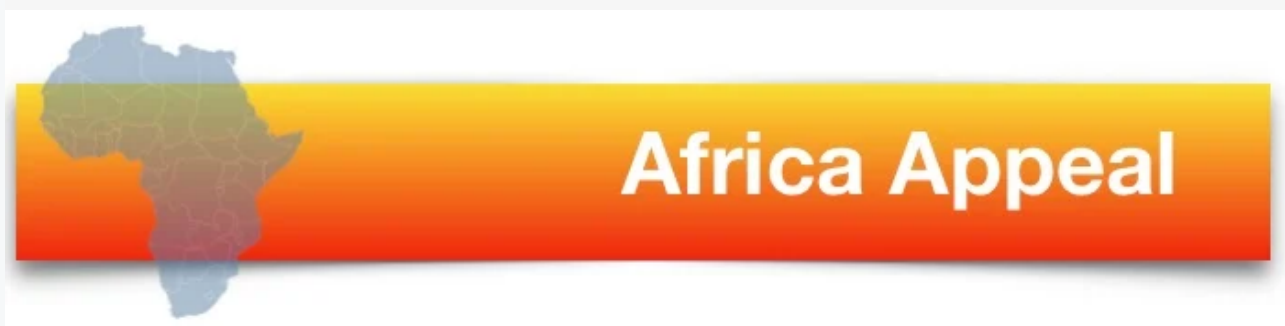
